Commemoration of the Pontiff St. James of Nisibis, hermit St. Maruge and Bishop St. Melitus

Pontiff St. James of Nisibis is one of the authoritative and beloved saints of the Universal Church. He deserved the epithet "Thaumaturge (Wonderworker) for the numerous miracles relating to his name. According to hagiographical sources St. James was from a Parthian dynasty and the nephew of St. Gregory the Illuminator. When the family members of Anak the Parthian were killed, nurses secretly fled to Caesaria taking with them baby Suren and James, where they were educated in Christian spirit. Soon after, baby James and his sister Sakden were taken to Persia and for a while lived in the royal palace. However, James refused a safe and well-to-do life and became a hermit. He left for Nisibis where he met hermit St. Maruge, who was famous for leading a life befitting saints. Learning from the hermit Maruge that many people despite their conversion to true faith were skeptic and suspicious about the existence of Noah's Ark, James decided to climb the mountain in order to see the Ark and bring a piece of it back. Despite his unwavering willpower he couldn't reach the peak and after long suffering, he had a short nap. The angel visited him in his dream and put a piece of the Ark under his head. According to the tradition in the place where St. James had lain down there appeared a cold stream having healing and miraculous qualities. Later, a church bearing the saint's name was built beside a nearby stream. The piece of the Ark, to this day, is kept in the museum of the Mother See of Holy Etchmiadzin. He is one of the clergymen who participated in the Nicene Council in 325. After the death of the Bishop of Nisibis, God appeared to Maruge and told him that St. James was the deserving candidate for the Bishop of Nisibis. St. James passed away in 350, after leading the flock for a long time. Bishop St. Mielitus was born in Melitene, Armenia Minor. In 358 he was the Bishop of Sebastia. In 360 he ascended the throne of Antioch. He struggled against the Arians. In 381 he presided over the Second Ecumenical Council convened in Constantinople but unfortunately passed away before the end of the Council.

U. Հակոբ Մծբնա Հայրապետն Ընդհանրական Եկեղեցու հեղինակավոր և սիրված սրբերից է։ Կատարած բազում հրաշքների շնորհիվ նրան կոչել են նաև «Սքանչելագործե։ Վարքագրական աղբյուրների համաձայն` Մբ. Հակոբը պարթևական տոհմից էր և մեր առաջին Հայրապետ Մբ. Գրիգոր Լուսավորչի հորաքրոջ որդին։ Երբ Անակ Պարթևի տոհմը բնաջնջվել է, դայակները մանուկ Սուրենին և Հակոբին փախցրել են Կեսարիա, ուր նրանք դաստիարակվել են քրիստոնեական ոգով։ Շատ չանցած, մանուկ Հակոբն իր քրոջ Սակդենի հետ տեղափոխվում են Պարսկաստան և որոշ

ժամանակ ապրում արքունիքում։ Մակայն Հակոբը թողել է այդ ձոխ կյանքը՝ դարձել ձգնավոր։ Հետո գնացել է Մծբին՝ հանդիպել Մարուգե ձգնավորին, որն հռչակված էր սրբակենցաղությամբ։ Նրանից լսելով, որ մարդկանցից շատերը թեպետ հավատքի են եկել, բայց թերահավատ են և կասկածում են Նոյյան տապանի գոյությանը, որոշել է բարձրանալ լեռը՝ տապանը տեսնել և մի մասնիկ բերել։ Հակառակ անկոտրում կամքին՝ չի կարողացել հասնել Արարատի գագաթը և երկար տանջվելուց հետո նիրհել։ Երազում հրեշտակն այցելել է նրան և տապանից մի մասունք դրել գլխատակին։

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS

The first reading is from the Second Letter of Paul to Hebrews (1:1-14)

In the past God spoke to our ancestors through the prophets at many times and in various ways, but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, and through whom also he made the universe. The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being, sustaining all things by his powerful word. After he had provided purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven. So he became as much superior to the angels as the name he has inherited is superior to theirs.

The second reading is from the Holy Gospel of Jesus Christ according to Luke (17:1-10)

Jesus said to his disciples: "Things that cause people to stumble are bound to come, but woe to anyone through whom they come. It would be better for them to be thrown into the sea with a millstone tied around their neck than to cause one of these little ones to stumble. So watch yourselves. "If your brother or sister sins against you, rebuke them; and if they repent, forgive them. Even if they sin against you seven times in a day and seven times come back to you saying 'I repent,' you must forgive them." The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith!" He replied, "If you have faith as small as a mustard seed, you can say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it will obey you. "Suppose one of you has a servant plowing or looking

after the sheep. Will he say to the servant when he comes in from the field, 'Come along now and sit down to eat'? Won't he rather say, 'Prepare my supper, get yourself ready and wait on me while I eat and drink; after that you may eat and drink'? Will he thank the servant because he did what he was told to do? So you also, when you have done everything you were told to do, should say, 'We are unworthy servants; we have only done our duty.'


